## 1. General description

Planar Maximum Efficiency General Application (MEGA) Schottky barrier rectifier with an integrated guard ring for stress protection, encapsulated in a SOD128 small and flat lead Surface-Mounted Device (SMD) plastic package.




Fig. 1. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values





Fig. 2. Transient thermal impedance from junction to ambient as a function of pulse duration; typical values




Fig. 4. Forward current as a function of forward voltage; typical values




Fig. 5. Reverse current as a function of reverse voltage; typical values




Fig. 6. Diode capacitance as a function of reverse voltage; typical values




Fig. 7. Average forward power dissipation as a function of average forward current; typical values




Fig. 8. Average reverse power dissipation as a function of reverse voltage; typical values




Fig. 9. Average reverse power dissipation as a function of reverse voltage; typical values




Fig. 10. Average reverse power dissipation as a function of reverse voltage; typical values






Fig. 11. Average forward current as a function of ambient temperature; typical values








Fig. 15. Reverse recovery definition




Fig. 16. Forward recovery definition




Fig. 17. Duty cycle definition




Fig. 18. Package outline CFP5 (SOD128)





Fig. 19. Reflow soldering footprint for CFP5 (SOD128)
